HALF DAY TOURS FROM GLASGOW

Glasgow City Tour (3.5-4 hours)

Enjoy a panoramic tour of Glasgow City Centre from the comfort of your touring coach. First we will see the historic Cathedral and Merchant City, then the Georgian grandeur of Blythswood Square, followed by Kelvingrove Art Gallery and the University Campus. Later we will cross the River Clyde to visit the world famous Burrell Art Collection in Pollok Country Park. If we are lucky we may also see the largest herd of Highland Cattle in Britain, who live in the Park.

Glengoyne Malt Whisky Distillery & Loch Lomond (4 hours)

Travelling from Glasgow, we drive to the foot of the Campsie Fells where we will visit Pretty Glengoyne Distillery. We will see how Scotland's national drink is produced - and there will be a taste of the end product for those who wish! From here we make our way to the Loch Lomond National Park



to enjoy the stunning views of the loch from our viewpoint at Loch Lomond Shores visitor centre.

Loch Lomond (4 hours)

From Glasgow we travel along the banks of the River Clyde to Helensburgh, and then through scenic Glen Fruin to Loch Lomond where we will board a cruiser for a relaxing sail on the loch. Our drive back to Glasgow will take us along the "bonnie, bonnie, banks" of Loch Lomond from where we can enjoy magnificent views.

Ayr and Burns Country (4 hours)

Our journey takes us through the golfing town of Troon, where we will see the famous Championship links course. In the small village of Alloway we will visit Robert Burns cottage, where the famous poet was born in 1759. For those who wish there is also an opportunity to visit the Land O'Burns Centre to learn about the life and times of Burns, before returning to Glasgow.

FULL DAY TOURS FROM GLASGOW

Stirling and the Trossachs (7 hours)

From Glasgow we travel northwards to the historic town of Stirling, once the home of the Scottish Kings and Queens. After a guided tour of the castle there will be some free time in the town of Stirling before we continue to the pretty little town of Callander. From here we will drive over the dramatic Duke's Pass to Aberfoyle in the heart of the Trossachs. This afternoon there will be an opportunity to shop in the Scottish Sheep Centre woollen shop before enjoying the scenic drive over the Campsie Fells and back to Glasgow.



Edinburgh City Tour (7.5-8 hours)

Our drive to Edinburgh takes us past the historic town of Linlithgow with excellent views of Linlithgow Palace, the birthplace of Mary Queen of Scots. We will stop in South Queensferry, just outside Edinburgh, to enjoy the magnificent views of the Forth Bridges. We will then begin our tour of the city. First we will visit the Georgian New Town, with its sweeping crescents and terraces, and then we will see the historic Royal Mile with its charming wynds and closes. The highlight of the day is a visit to Edinburgh Castle to see the Scottish Crown Jewels. The remainder of the afternoon is free for shopping or further sightseeing.

Inveraray and Loch Lomond (8 hours)

From Glasgow we travel along the banks of the river Clyde to Helensburgh and then through scenic Glen Fruin to Loch Lomond. Leaving Arrochar we cross over the "Rest and be Thankful" mountain pass, and drive along the scenic shores of Loch Fyne to the lovely little town of Inveraray. First we will visit Inveraray Castle, the home of the Duke of Argyll, and then there will be free time to take a stroll round the town. We will return to Glasgow by way of Loch Lomond Shores, where we can enjoy panoramic views of the Loch.

Scone Palace and the Fair City of Perth (8 hours)

We will make our way to Stirling to enjoy the excellent view of Stirling Castle perched high atop a volcanic plug. On the outskirts of Perth we stop to visit Scone Palace, home to the Earls of Mansfield and ancient coronation site of Scottish kings. After a tour of the Palace and its extensive grounds we will continue into the heart of Perth where there will be free time for shopping and/or independent sightseeing. We return to Glasgow through the pleasant market town of Crieff.



Traquair House and the Scottish Borders (8 hours)

From Glasgow we travel through the Clyde Valley to the ancient market town of Lanark, which dates from the 10th Century. We will stop to visit New Lanark Heritage Village, founded in 1784 as an industrial village, but more famous for the social housing and welfare experiments conducted by the mill manager, Robert Owen. We continue through the rolling Border countryside to Peebles on the River Tweed and, following the banks of the river, we make our way to Traquair House which is the oldest inhabited house in Scotland. The house has a strong connection with the Stuart dynasty. Indeed Bonnie Prince Charlie visited the house in 1745 on his ill-fated march south to capture the Crown.

The Isle of Arran (9 hours)

From Glasgow we travel along the Clyde Coast through Skelmorlie and Largs. This route offers some of the finest views of the Firth of Clyde. At Ardrossan we catch the ferru for the 55 minute sailing to Brodick on the Island of Arran - often described as Scotland in miniature. At Brodick we will visit Brodick Castle. This site has been fortified since Viking times and the present structure dates back to the 13th century, with 17th and 19th century extensions. After a scenic drive on the Island's famous String Road, with magnificent views to Kintyre, we will return by ferry to Ardrossan, and back to Glasgow.

Oban, Highlands, Glens and Castles (9 hours)

Enjoy some of Scotland's most beautiful lochs, glens and mountains on this scenic tour. Our journey from Glasgow takes us first to the "bonnie, bonnie banks" of Loch Lomond and then past romantic Kilchurn Castle. We will stop for a visit to the bustling fishing town of Oban, and then continue to the little 18th Century town of Inveraray. Here we will visit Inveraray Jail,



a fascinating 19th Century prison. Our journey homewards takes us through the Argyll Forest Park to the Victorian resort of Dunoon, where we board a ferry for a pleasant 20 minute sail across the Firth of Clyde.

Highland Magic (8 hours)

A scenic drive along the banks of Loch Lomond will bring us to the pretty village of Luss where we will stop for a stroll. Our drive continues over the impressive "Rest & be Thankful" mountain pass to Inveraray which sits on the shores of Loch Fyne. We will visit Inveraray Castle, the splendid home of the Duke of Argyll, and then we will show you the Younger Botanic Garden. Here we will see an impressive avenue of soft-barked Wellingtonias and wonderful displays of exotic plants, including 250 species of Rhododendron. A short sail across the River Clyde will bring us back to Glasgow.

HALF DAY TOURS FROM EDINBURGH

Edinburgh City Tour (3.5-4 hours)

From the comfort of your touring coach discover the history and beauty of Edinburgh. We start the tour by visiting the Georgian New Town, with its sweeping crescents and terraces, then we tour the historic Royal Mile, with its enchanting wynds and closes. The highlight is a visit to Edinburgh Castle where we can see the Scottish Crown Jewels as well as enjoying the panoramic views of the city skyline from the battlements.

St Andrews - Home of Golf (4 hours)

Discover the home of golf and much more besides. From Edinburgh we cross the River Forth and tour through the Kingdom of Fife to the scenic fishing village of Anstruther. On our arrival in St Andrews there will be an orientation tour including the famous Old Course and a visit to St Andrews



Cathedral and Castle. The remainder of the day is free for you to explore on your own.

Stirling Castle (4 hours)

From Edinburgh we pass historic Linlithgow Palace, the birthplace of Mary Queen of Scots as we make our way to the historic town of Stirling. On our arrival we will visit magnificent Stirling Castle which sits atop a volcanic plug. Stirling was once home to the Scottish Court and during our tour we will visit the Royal Apartments as well as the Chapel Royal, where Mary Queen of Scots was crowned. There will be free time in the town of Stirling before we return to Edinburgh.

Hopetoun House (3.5-4 hours)

Our first stop will be South Queensferry, where we will enjoy the view of the Forth Bridges. Next we drive along the river banks to Hopetoun House, the home of the Marquis of Linlithgow. Hopetoun dates from 1699 and was built to a design by Sir William Bruce. The house contains a number of notable paintings by Gainsborough and Raeburn. Within the substantial grounds of the house are a wildlife centre and various nature trails to enjoy.

Whisky & Rosslyn Chapel (4 hours)

From Edinburgh we make the short drive to the pretty village of Pencaitland, where we visit Glenkinchie malt whisky distillery. After our tour of the distillery there is a "wee dram" so that we can taste the end product! Next we travel to Rosslyn Chapel, a fascinating building whose aura of mystery and magic is known World-Wide, thanks to the popular book and movie 'The Da Vinci Code'. You can discover more about the history of this place and marvel at the intricate carvings during our visit.

FULL DAY TOURS FROM EDINBURGH

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Blair Castle & Pitlochry (7 hours)

Travelling from Edinburgh we cross the Forth Road Bridge and drive through the Kingdom of Fife to Perth. We will visit the Caithness Glass Works, to see how intricate paperweights are hand-made. Then it's into the Highlands as we make our way to Blair Castle. Blair Castle is the ancestral home of the Duke of Atholl, the only man in Britain allowed his own standing army - the Atholl Highlanders. After time to visit the castle we make the short drive to Pitlochry, a pretty little town on the River Tummel, where we will visit Edradour malt whisky distillery, the smallest in Scotland. There is free time in Pitlochry before we start our return journey to Edinburgh.

Loch Lomond & The Trossachs (8.5 hours)

The ancient town of Stirling is our first stop where we will visit magnificent Stirling Castle. We then travel to Callander, a popular holiday town that dates from Victorian times. Next we enter the Loch Lomond National Park and tour through the Trossachs, a scenic area of lochs and mountains before arriving in the pretty town of Aberfoyle. At Loch Lomond we will join a cruiser to see the "bonnie, bonnie banks" from the best vantage point, the loch itself. We'll return to Edinburgh by way of Glasgow, Scotland's largest city.

St Andrews - Home of Golf (7.5-8 hours)

On this tour you can discover the home of golf and much more besides. After leaving Edinburgh we cross the River Forth and enter the Kingdom of Fife. Our journey will take us to the East Neuk of Fife where we will visit the scenic fishing village of Anstruther. On arrival in St Andrews there will be an orientation tour of the town before enjoying free time to explore the grounds of the ancient university, the castle or Cathedral, visit the famed Old Course and British Golf Museum, or simply shop!



Traquair House & The Borders (7.5-8 hours)

From Edinburgh we travel through the rolling Border countryside to visit the popular market town of Peebles, which sits astride the River Tweed. We follow the banks of the river as we make our way to Traquair House, one of Scotland's most important historic buildings. The house has a strong connection with the Stuart dynasty, indeed Bonnie Prince Charlie visited the house in 1745 on his ill-fated march south to capture the Crown. Our return to Edinburgh will take us to Galashiels, with its weaving traditions and picturesque Dryburgh Abbey, which dates back to the 12th century.

Scone Palace & The Fair City of Perth (7.5-8 hours)

Our journey takes us across the Forth Road Bridge, with its magnificent views, and on through the Kingdom of Fife. On the outskirts of Perth we stop to visit Scone Palace, home to the Earls of Mansfield and the ancient coronation site of the Scottish kings. After a tour of the Palace and its extensive grounds we will continue into the heart of Perth for free time for shopping and/or independent sightseeing. We return to Edinburgh through the pleasant market town of Crieff, Gleneagles and Glen Devon.

Day One

Braveheart and Bonnie Banks

Departing from Edinburgh or Glasgow, our first stop is at majestic Stirling Castle, to hear the story about the real "Braveheart" - Sir William Wallace. We'll then enjoy a scenic tour along the "Bonnie, Bonnie Banks" of Loch Lomond. A drive over lonely Rannoch Moor brings us to the dramatic scenery of Glen Coe, scene of the terrible massacre in 1692. Our travels continue through the Great Glen then along the entire length of Loch Ness (keep a close watch, just in case!) to Inverness.

Dinner and overnight: Inverness

Day Two

The Isle, Castles and Monsters

Today we enjoy the highlight of our tour - a full day excursion to the beautiful island of Skye. We'll visit Eilean Donan Castle, perched on its island at the head of Loch Duich. You will marvel at the views of Skye from the castle ramparts, but soon we'll be crossing "over the sea to Skye" and driving through the island to Portree, the island's pretty main town.

Dinner and overnight: Inverness

Day Three

Golfers and a wee dram!

After breakfast we enjoy a spectacular drive through the Spey Valley to the Drumochter Pass and onwards to the rolling Perthshire hills. Our first visit is to delightful Edradour malt whisky distillery, where we'll discover how "the water of life" is produced - there is even a taste of the end product! Our next visit is to St Andrews, known as the home of golf. You'll be free to visit the famed Old Course or simply stroll around this attractive university town. The coach pauses at pretty South Queensferry to admire the view



over the Firth of Forth before making the short drive to Edinburgh or Glasgow.

GLIMPSE OF SCOTLAND

In just three days you will discover the highlights of Scotland - Loch Lomond, Glen Coe, Loch Ness, Inverness, The Whisky Trail, Aberdeen and St Andrews!

Day One

Murder and Mystery Leave Edinburgh or Glasgow for the short drive to the "bonnie, bonnie banks" of Loch Lomond. We'll make a stop in the pretty village of Luss where you can enjoy wonderful views over the loch to Ben Lomond. Next we will travel through Glen Coe and hear the sad tale of the terrible 1692 massacre before arriving in the town of Fort William. Then there's a relaxing drive through the Great Glen to the mysterious waters of Loch Ness - keep the camera ready, just in case!

Dinner and overnight: Inverness

Day Two

Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Water of Life We'll start the day with a visit to Culloden Moor, where Bonnie Prince Charlie's Jacobite army was routed by government troupes in the last battle ever fought on British soil. No visit to this part of Scotland would be complete without a visit to a distillery, and so we join the whisky trail to learn how the "water of life" is produced and enjoy a wee taste of the end product! Then it is over the dramatic Lecht mountain pass to the gentle scenery of Royal Deeside. We will make a visit to Crathie Kirk, where the Royal Family worship when staying at nearby Balmoral Castle, before making our way to Aberdeen.

Dinner and overnight: Aberdeen



Day Three

Glamis Castle and Golfers Our journey south takes us through the rolling Angus countryside to Glamis Castle, the childhood home of the late Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother. There has been a castle on this site since 1372 and there are strong connections with Shakespeare's Macbeth. Next on the itinerary is St Andrews, famed as the home of golf, where you will be free to visit the Old Course or simply stroll around this attractive university town. The coach will pause in the pretty village of South Queensferry so that we can admire the view over the Firth of Forth before returning to either Edinburgh or Glasgow.

INVERNESS, LOCH NESS AND THE HIGHLANDS

This two day tour will let you explore one of Scotland's most popular cities, at your own pace; go monster spotting by Loch Ness and see some spectacular scenery. This really is essential Scotland!

Day One

Departing from Edinburgh or Glasgow we make our way to lonely Rannoch Moor and into Glen Coe, Scotland's most famous glen and the scene of the terrible massacre in 1692. We will make a stop in the midst of this awe-inspiring scenery where you can enjoy the magic of this special place. From Fort William the striking scenery of the Great Glen unfolds ahead of us – first Loch Lochy, then Loch Oich and finally Loch Ness. We will tour through the attractive village of Fort Augustus then drive the entire length of Loch Ness. We will make a stop at Urquhart Castle, where you can visit the Castle and take a cruise on the loch. Shortly we will arrive in Inverness, our home for tonight.

Dinner and overnight: Inverness



Day Two

After a leisurely breakfast and free time in Inverness we will visit nearby Culloden Moor, where Bonnie Prince Charlie's Jacobite Army was routed by Government troops under the command of "Butcher" Cumberland. This bloody battle was the last ever fought on British soil.

Later we make our way through the gentle Spey Valley then on through stunning scenery as we drive over the Drumochter Pass. Keep a close watch for the deer that often come down to the roadside to graze. We will stop in the popular Victorian resort of Pitlochry, nestling on the banks of the River Tummel. Here we will visit little Edradour Malt Whisky Distillery to see how Scotland's National drink is produced. After our tour there is a chance to taste the end product! From Perth we make our way homewards to journey's end in Edinburgh or Glasgow.
